# The Friends of St James the Great, Thorley

The Friends of St James the Great, Thorley was founded in 1983 to



assist the Rector and Parochial Church Council in maintaining and beautifying the Church and Churchyard.

We seek to raise funds in support of these aims by organising events, such as the Festival of Flowers and Music which is held every year over the August Bank Holiday Weekend, and

through membership subscriptions. We have raised over £135,000 to date, which has enabled numerous projects to be undertaken.

Our remaining fund raising activities this year include the sale of Sunday Afternoon Teas in the Church from 2:30 pm to 5:00 pm until the end of October. Soup and a Roll will then be served from 12:00 noon to 2:00 pm every Sunday over the winter months, with Afternoons Teas re-commencing from the first Sunday in March next year. On the evening of Saturday 10 October 2009 we will once again be holding our popular Prize Quiz Evening, and on Saturday 21 November 2009 an Autumn Craft Fair. We are currently raising funds to replace our organ. Whilst still operational, its chequered history means that there are serious shortcomings in both its functionality and its ability to cope with the tonal and dynamic variation so much associated with even a relatively 'basic' organ.






