#### THE 2012 FESTIVAL OF FLOWERS & MUSIC



The theme of this year's Festival is The Seasons of the Year.

The Festival is organised by the Friends of St James the Great, Thorley. Established in 1983, the Friends raise funds to assist in maintaining and beautifying the Church and Churchyard.

This year's Festival has as its objective raising money in support of our latest project, the purchase and installation of new Church lighting. This follows the successful completion last year of our previous project, the raising of the £18,500 required to repair the stonework and stained glass of a number of the Church windows, on which work will start shortly.

At last year's Festival we had a display celebrating the fourhundredth anniversary of the publication, in 1611, of the King James Bible, for which Francis Burley, the Rector of St James at the time, was appointed by King James I as one of the 47 translators.

This year marks the three-hundred-and-fiftieth anniversary of the publication, in 1662, of the edition of the Book of Common Prayer that has remained in use to this day. Robert Pory, then Rector of Thorley, was appointed to the committee of seven charged with undertaking its final revision. Take a look at the display in the Emmaus Centre where you can learn more about Robert, who was ejected from St James during the Civil War following his open defiance of Parliament, but re-instated and richly rewarded at the Restoration for what King Charles II described as his *particular and eminent sufferings for Ourself and the Church*.



  - Monday 4:00 pm


Times for individual items are displayed throughout the site.


