


THE 2014 FESTIVAL OF FLOWERS & MUSIC



The theme of this year's Festival is

Saints - Familiar and Unfamiliar.

The Festival is organised by the Friends of St James the Great, Thorley.

Formed in 1983, the Friends have raised almost £200,000 over the

last 30 years to assist the Parochial Church Council in the maintenance of the Church and churchyard. This has funded numerous projects including, in the past five years, the purchase of a new Church Organ, the restoration of Church stonework and a number of stained glass windows, and repairs to the churchyard wall. Most recently we have been raising funds to enable the installation of new Church lighting.

To mark the 100th anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War the Friends have put together a display about the men of Thorley who served in that war. It is based on a notebook kept by the Revd John Edward Ingleby Procter, the Rector of Thorley at the time. In this notebook he recorded details of the 103 servicemen of the parish, with their names, home addresses, pre-war occupations and employers, the dates when they enlisted, the regiments that they joined, where they served, their military awards, and what happened to them. This display can be viewed in the Emmaus Centre throughout the Festival, where a commemorative booklet with the text of the notebook matched with photographs of a number of the servicemen can also be purchased.





When: Saturday, Sunday & Monday between 2:00 pm & 4:00 pm.


