

THE 2015 FESTIVAL OF FLOWERS & MUSIC

The theme of this year's Festival is *A Good Read*.



It is organised by the Friends of St James the Great, Thorley.

Formed in 1983, the Friends have raised over £140,000 since the year 2000 to assist the Parochial Church Council in the maintenance of the Church and Churchyard. This has funded numerous projects including, in the past five years, the

purchase of a new Church Organ, the restoration of Church stonework and stained glass windows, and repairs to our Churchyard wall. Most recently we have been raising funds to enable the installation of new Church lighting. Having now raised the sum required, we are eagerly awaiting its installation later this year, and have set as our new objective enabling the complete redecoration of the interior of the Church.

The other key fundraising events in the Friends calendar are our Quiz Evening in February, a sale of plants in May, the provision of Sunday afternoon teas from the Church Room during the summer months, and an Autumn Craft Fair in November, with this year's being held on Saturday 7 November from 11:00 am to 3:30 pm.

For many years a small team of volunteers from the Friends has been responsible for the upkeep of our beautiful Churchyard. The Friends also donate and maintain all the necessary equipment for this important activity. The Churchyard covers a whole acre of grass, paths, hedges and trees. We would welcome more volunteers to help look after this wonderful asset. If you can spare an hour or two per month and are over 18, we would be pleased to hear from you. 


